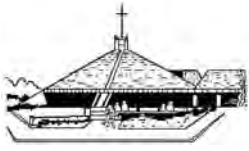

Pastor's Column

As I reported at our congregational meeting on August 15th, we have accomplished a great deal in our *Transforming for Mission* emphasis in the past 15+ months. You will read of those accomplishments in the minutes contained in this newsletter. And while the accomplishment of the prescriptions we received from the visitation team is something to be proud of doing, the real joy has been in the journey we are taking.

I cannot begin to tell you how fulfilling it is to hear from all the residents of Wittenberg that attend our weekly Bible class or our monthly worship time of their love and appreciation for our church in providing a safe community for them to reside. We have started to build bridges to these residents and we have several of them who now frequent our services on Sunday. The real joy lies in the possibilities of expanding our contacts and ministry to them. Please continue to pray for opportunity to touch more of them with Jesus' love.

Our school ministry continues to amaze and astonish me with our Father's goodness. There are many private Christian schools in our area who have been forced to reduce staff, curriculum offerings and programs because of decreased enrollment. And while we have felt some effect of the economic climate, we have been blessed to continue operating without having to cut back in these critical areas to date. This is a tribute to God's faithfulness and to our staff's careful use of our limited resources. Please continue to pray for them and for increased enrollment – this is the best way to insure that our school will impact the lives of our children and families with the love of Jesus.

It is absolutely critical for us at Calvary to see that our future lies in planning for and taking advantage of the ministry opportunities that our school and Wittenberg I and II affords us. God has blessed us by providing these ministries through the foresight and hard work of those who have gone before us (many of whom are still with us).

We have so much to be thankful for in the blessings God has provided. We have much to be proud of and celebrate. And we have so much more to be excited about and look forward to, because the best is yet to come!

This 'N That

Kudos to Sue Ellis and crew! What a great week we had with the @140 children we had each day at our *High Seas Adventure*. It is a week that has had some wonderful fruit. We have gained 2 new families that

are regularly attending service and several of our new school families were in attendance. I have received several very positive comments about the celebration Sunday and fellowship that followed. Sue and crew are already looking forward to next year!

Kudos also to our dedicated Sunday School staff!

Every week we have the great privilege of having several of our members, (Sue Ellis, Faith Scheuermann, Leanne & Megan Mueller, Stacy Coleman, Norma Blank, Gina & Victoria Gerome, Kim Heggins) spend our Sunday School hour sharing the wonderful stories and truths of the Bible with our church and school family children. This is an incredibly important ministry at Calvary, so please, let them know how much they are appreciated, and make sure your children attend and have them invite their friends to come as well.

What do Lutheran Christians believe? I will be starting a Sunday morning Bible class on September 19th that addresses our confession of the Christian faith, both the confessions we share with all other Christian churches and a few of the uniquely Lutheran stances that are different. This class will meet from 9:30-10:30am in the Conference Room. This class is open to everyone, either as introductory or as a refresher to our understanding of Holy Scripture.

Congregational meeting follow-up. On August 15th at our congregational meeting we passed a deficit budget of @ \$124,000, with 142 students enrolled as of that date. Today (8/24), we have 147 enrolled, which will positively impact our deficit. We have set another meeting in November (specific date will be published later) to update the deficit and to make any further adjustments necessary. The Board of Governors (BOG) presented a tuition figure goal of \$820,000 by November 1st that would reduce the deficit to \$74,000.

Return to two services on September 12th. We will return to our normal schedule of two services on the 12th, organ led service at 8:00am, Sunday School and Bible classes at 9:30am and our contemporary service at 10:45am. Communion will be served at 8am on the 1st and 3rd Sundays, and at 10:45am on the 2nd and 4th Sundays. On any 5th Sunday of any month we have a Fellowship Sunday service at 10am followed by a meal to celebrate our oneness as a church.

School News from Miss Hackerd

We are looking forward to an exciting year. We have made some changes and expect that they will improve our school even more. One of the changes is how the teachers in grades 3-8 will report student grades to families.

Calvary Lutheran School will be using an online grading program this school year, 2010-2011, for grades 3-8. Parents and students will have access to this program to check the student's progress at their convenience. Grades will be updated regularly and printed progress reports will not be issued this year. Free internet access is available at public libraries. For those families who do not have internet service, a paper progress report can be requested on the following dates: Sept. 21st, Oct. 5th, Nov. 16th, Dec. 14th, Feb. 8th, Mar. 1st, April 12th, May 17th.

The program is called Engrade and is available at www.engage.com. When school starts, families will receive a confidential student number per child. They will use that number to set up access to the child's grades. They can send the teacher a question or concern through the program itself using the **My Messages** tab at the top. Teachers will also send alerts and messages in the same way. To check the student's grade at any time, log on at the Engrade web site. Anyone can go to the teacher's Engrade homepage at www.engage.com/teachername.

We hope this will help families be aware of how their student is doing and facilitate more communication between teachers and families. This will help us work as partners to help the student be successful here at Calvary.

BOARD OF GOVERNANCE

Meeting 7, July 13, 2010

Present: Barbara Adams, Pastor Bothwell, Darlene Goldhammer, Jeff Jensen, Lee Strom

The meeting began with Bible Study led by Barbara Adams on the use/misuse of the word, "can't." The scripture references used were: Ephesians 4:29; Matthew 17:20; Luke 1:37. As Christians we need to be very selective in the words we use because we are to be a reflection of Christ. When we say "can't," do we really mean "won't," for whatever reason we don't wish to do something. Using the word "can't" may mean we don't believe God is able to do a particular thing, especially if "we" are part of the action! There is also the very real problem of our words spreading inaccurate or damaging information.. The study was followed by a time of prayer with all present participating. Minutes from Meeting 6 were previously confirmed by email.

Pastor conducted a time of leadership training based on Chapters 2-3 of the book we are using followed by discussion. We will review Chapter 4 at the July 27 meeting. Pastor will be meeting with the elders this week for discussion of various items but focusing especially on worship. He will also meet with Trudy Packard to discuss the formulation of the School Committee and other business.

Pastor reminded us that the Worship Schedule he prepared before going on vacation had all the information needed for each Sunday service until the summer schedule ends. The schedule is also posted on the wall of the church above the place where the service bulletins are stacked. Budget proposals from the various committees were turned in, and they will be the subject of a special BOG meeting the week of July 18. Signers for the bank account have completed their paperwork. Work is continuing for the VBS final celebration on Sunday, August 8.

A donation of \$500 made by the family of a deceased member will be identified and moved into an LWML Funeral Fund. That was the original intent of the family when the money was put in the General Fund. Barbara showed us copy of the Master Calendar and indicated that those who wished could have a copy. Jeff will schedule the budget meeting for the week of July 18 and contact the BOG.

Lee closed with prayer.

BOARD OF GOVERNANCE

Meeting 9, July 30, 2010

Present: Barbara Adams, Pastor Bothwell, Darlene Goldhammer, Bill Martchenke, Lee Strom, Jeff Jensen

The meeting was opened with Bible study led by Lee Strom using verses from I Chronicles, II Samuel and Hebrews 11. The point of the study was to illustrate value, meaning and connection between the Old and New Testaments. Lee illustrated specific instances where the gospel as presented in the NT was made more understandable and memorable by referring to additional details in the OT. The gospel is the "spine" and the OT and NT are the support. The study was followed by prayer by all.

Pastor presented the fourth session on leadership training. relating to how systems work. Discussion followed as we applied the ideas to our congregation.

Jeff distributed copies of the final budget to be presented to the congregation August 1. The BOG reviewed assignments for the VBS Sunday celebration.

Pastor reported that the keyboard person, who is part of our contemporary service, is leaving.. This makes it necessary to consider possible options for our second service, which the elders will review with Pastor.

New Business

Pastor presented the following from the Board of Directors of Wittenberg Manor:

“It is the desire of the Board of Directors of Wittenberg Manor I and II to pursue the addition of Wittenberg Manor III. There is a tremendous need of housing for low income seniors. At the present time we have a waiting list of over 200. Although Section 8 funding is no longer available, there are other avenues to provide housing for seniors in the low and moderately low income level. We are asking for the congregation’s approval and support to proceed. With your approval a non-binding agreement to pursue this matter will be submitted to Barcelon Management Company to do some preliminary investigation. There will be no financial obligation to Calvary. The Board is excited about this and would covet your support.”

This item will be on the agenda for the Congregational Meeting. The government runs these properties but looks for a non-profit organization to sponsor them. The Wittenberg Board is under the authority of our congregation.

Pastor presented the need to begin establishing committees. Some will be short term to complete a single project and others will be long term. We will need committees for school, youth, fellowship, marketing/outreach, children’s ministry (not school related), church policy and church properties. Principal Trudy Packard has provided the BOG with a possible list of School Committee members.

Trudy has asked the BOG for help on Rally Day August 22. The event will be a different format this year; it will take place right after the service. The teachers are being installed during the service and a brunch will be served from about 10-11:30am. Teachers will be available to meet the parents and students.

It was stated that the church’s Human Resources Manual needs to be updated. Jeff will investigate the situation and we will determine whether it should be done by a short-term committee or other specific individuals.

Direct Missions has been budgeted for \$10,000 to be distributed among organizations outside of Calvary. Members of the congregation are asked to present organizations they would like included in the gift.

A steel covering has been purchased with proceeds from the school auction and will be installed in the picnic table area between the school buildings so students will have a sheltered place to eat on questionable weather days. We discussed the installation of a Knox Box so that the Fire Department would have access to our campus in case of an emergency when no one is available on the property.

Faith Scheuermann, who is in charge of Summer Sunday School, asked that she might hold class at the same time as the Congregational Meeting. We agreed with the request.

Bill Martchenke closed in prayer.

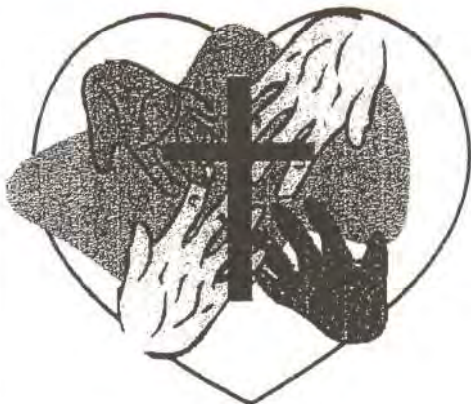
