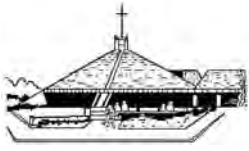

Pastor's Column

St. Paul wrote in the fifth chapter of his second letter to the church in Corinth – “*Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, they are a new creation, the old has gone, the new has come.*” What wonderful words to contemplate as we enter into yet another new year. The old year 2010 is drawing to a close. It has, like most years before it, run the gamut of experience – some of those have been joyous and wondrous – some have been difficult and full of sadness. And we know that the new year of 2011 will hold some of both of these for us as well.

The difference for you and me is that while we may not know what this year truly holds for us, we know who holds us as we journey through this life – the Good Shepherd, Jesus. In the chapter immediately preceding these words of hope and promise, Paul reminds us that our hope is not in the temporary reality in which we live, but in the eternal gift we have received in the Babe of Bethlehem. My true prayer for each and every one of us who are part of the Calvary family is that we grow stronger each day in our new life. And my challenge to each and every one of us is that we take steps to ensure that our faith grows, because growth does not happen without effort.

I will be addressing these questions in the coming weeks and months in sermons and Bible classes in order to help you (and me) continue to grow in the blessings God promises to bestow on his faithful servants.

My true prayer and hope for all of us are contained in Paul's encouragement to the church at Rome, when he wrote: “*Therefore, I urge you, brothers, in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as living sacrifices, holy and pleasing to God—this is your spiritual act of worship. ²Do not conform any longer to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is—his good, pleasing and perfect will.*” And I truly wish you all a blessed new year!

BOARD OF GOVERNANCE

November 3, 2010

Barbara Adams opened with a devotion titled "Why Does the Church Always Ask for Money? God's Blessings Are Free." The disciples were sent out to minister without charge. Their needs were to be supplied by those being blessed. Our forgiveness was purchased by Jesus' precious blood, but it is the job of the church to distribute the blessings, and those who do the work need to be paid. Barbara opened with prayer.

The purpose of the meeting was to discuss our current and future budgets, concentrating on the current deficit. We talked about options to be presented to the congregation at the special November 21 congregational meeting. These included:

1. Commitment from congregation to keep the school open
2. Possible salary cut of 5% for all staff members immediately
3. Staffing one less teacher next year

A meeting with the school staff will be scheduled for November 16.

Next BOG meeting will be Thursday, November 18.

Barbara closed the meeting with prayer.

BOARD OF GOVERNANCE

November 18, 2010

Members Present: Barbara Adams, Lee Strom, Darlene Goldhammer, Pastor Bothwell, Bill Martchenke, Jeff Jensen

Barbara opened with prayer.

Pastor stated that he had scheduled a meeting with Larry Tietmier who is retired and possibly interested in serving in some capacity as principal until the end of the school year. Five other individuals were also contacted about whether they might be interested, and we are waiting for possible responses.

An inspector for the Licensing Bureau for pre-schools will visit over Christmas vacation and talk about what is needed for us to expand our pre-school.

The November 21 Congregational Meeting was discussed. It was decided to use the meeting to distribute budget information, present options to be considered for reducing the budget and give members an opportunity to present their questions. We agreed to use paper ballots for members to confirm their continued commitment to supporting the school as one of Calvary's top ministries.

Bill Martchenke volunteered to meet with the school staff prior to the congregational meeting to discuss the impact of the budget on the school.

Our next meeting will be Thursday, December 4 at 6:30pm.

The meeting ended with prayer.

SPECIAL CONGREGATIONAL MEETING
December 5, 2010

Pastor opened the meeting with prayer. President Barbara Adams chaired the meeting. The purpose of the meeting was to determine what steps the congregation needs to take to reduce the budget deficit of \$97,007, which we are facing as presented at the Congregational Meeting November 21, 2010.

Jeff Jensen presented a budget recap for the 2009-2010 year and information about the deficit budget we voted in for the 2010-2011 year. Every family received a complete document providing that specific information, including actual amounts spent compared to projected amounts. The document was reviewed line-by-line with time for questions and discussion. Because of several changes that have occurred in the school operation, our deficit has been reduced to \$31,964. Members were encouraged to call Jeff Jensen if they had further questions after reviewing the data.

Bill Martchenke thanked members for presenting ideas on how to reduce the deficit and reminded us that the suggestion box is always available in the office for additional suggestions. Some of the ideas presented cannot be implemented immediately, but there were several that we will put into effect now.

1. Increase emphasis on stewardship through sermons, Bible study and education.
2. Alternative gift-giving ideas. (Example: use your Christmas gift-giving opportunities to gift the church.)
3. Approach Cougar Parent Association for a gift.
4. Continued effort to reclaim past-due tuition.
5. Put HUG money into the general fund.
6. Take advantage of available Thrivent funds. (Jeff will provide information.)
7. Continue to work on the suggestions we have been given and determine how we can implement them this year and into next year.
8. Corporately and individually prayerfully seek God's direction.

By working on the above suggestions, we hope to reduce the deficit by \$15,000 this budget year.

Barbara Adams presented the question of whether or not we would reduce salaries by 5% as of January 1, 2011. Plan A was NOT to reduce the current salaries. Plan B was to reduce all salaries by 5% as of January 1. Using paper ballots, Plan A overwhelmingly determined that salaries would not be reduced at this time.

Larry Tietmier, a recently retired principal from St. Paul's in Tracy, has been hired as a consultant for the remainder of the school year. He will be at our school a few days in December to become familiar with the territory. As of January 3, 2011, he will be in the office three days a week; possibly this will allow Margie Luehrs to return to her classroom and spend only one day a week in the office.

After we have reviewed the December and January financials, we will have another congregational meeting in February to update our financial status and plan of action.

Elder Hank Blank closed the meeting with prayer.

SPECIAL CONGREGATIONAL MEETING

November 21, 2010

The meeting was called to order by President Barbara Adams and opened with prayer by Pastor Bothwell. We started the school year with a deficit and the understanding that we would meet in November to reevaluate where we stand financially.

We have experienced the following in the first months of our school year. We anticipated 8 additional students would enroll, and we have actually gained 9. Our pre-school aide went from half to full time to accommodate the number of students. It was determined that we would provide tuition reductions where needed to fill our desks. Due to the downturn in the economy it was necessary to provide more reductions than anticipated, thus reducing the total tuition received. The cost of health care for school and church employees also skyrocketed. All of these factors contributed to our present financial condition.

The current financial statements are published in the "Chronicle" each month for you to review. We are now facing a deficit budget of \$97,007. A plan needs to be established to reduce that amount by at least 60% in the next year.

Voters were given paper ballots to express their continued commitment to the school as one of our top two ministries. Discussion followed. The vote was overwhelmingly in support of our school ministry.

A sheet of proposed options for budget reduction was presented for the congregation's consideration during the next two weeks. Members were encouraged to pray about the options, talk with one of the BOG members or Pastor if they have questions, give their additional written suggestions to Holly in the office by December 1. We will meet as a congregation on December 5, 12 Noon, to decide on what we want to do. The meeting closed with prayer.

At the Sunday meeting, Jeff will give a budget presentation covering the 2009-2010 and the 2010-2011 school years. Two plans will be presented for a vote. One plan will be for a 5% reduction in all salaries as of January 1, 2011, and one plan will be for no reduction in January.

Good suggestions for trimming our deficit were turned in by the congregation. A list of those we can implement immediately will be presented at the meeting. We also discussed the ones we could consider later in the school year and next school year.

The Guiding Principles were given final approval.

We adjourned with prayer.
